DID YOU KNOW

Do we need faith to heal someone?

Yes and no. Since it is God who does the healing and not us, we do not need faith to heal but we do need faith that God does heal so that we do ask for healing to occur. Some will say that healing did not occur because the person asking or receiving did not have enough faith. This is erroneous and dangerous thinking and can be hurtful in the extreme. God heals always but in God's time and in God's way. We may ask for a certain thing but God gives us what is best and we may not be able to see that. Sometimes our witness in how we respond to unexpected results, positive or negative in our opinion, can be the best or worst testimony to God's presence in our lives. Although we do not always understand or agree with God's direction, we need to recognise that God's love for us is consistent and enduring.
